

ANNUAL QUALITY ASSURANCE REPORT 2004-2005

It was in the year 2004 March; the NAAC peer team visited our college and granted the C +grade to the college. The evaluation done by the Peer Committee and the suggestion made thereafter provided a new impetus to the development of our college.

As a measure of implementing the suggestions of the Peer Team and for enhancing the quality of the college, by the beginning of the Academic year 2004-2005, along with the various committees for the internal functioning of the college, a Quality Assurance Cell and an Internal Quality Assurance Committee were constituted.

The Committees formulated various programmes for the enhancement of quality of education in college, keeping in mind its objectives

As a part of this the college was able to get permission from the University and State Government to start a post Graduate Diploma in Taxation Law, on self-financing basis which will provide opportunities to the students to practice as Income Tax Practitioners or Sales Tax Practitioners.

Curricular Aspects

Another significant development was that most of the teachers in our college were members of the Syllabus Revision Committee of the University this year. The Syllabus Revision Committee was able to update the syllabus of the existing Courses in tune with all present day requirements. The unitisation process of the syllabus started this year and the first year syllabus has been completely unitised according to the contents and time available.

Teachers from our college participated in Human Rights Outreach Programme jointly organised by NHRC and ILS Law College, Pune, Legal Education Seminar organised by Bar Council of Goa and Maharashtra and Seminar on current Trends in Forensic Medicine organised by High Court of Judicature, Mumbai (Aurangabad Bench) at Aurangabad.

Unit tests were conducted regularly to test the knowledge of the students. Continuous moot courts are arranged to test and enhance the professional skills of the students. The Final year LL.B. students of our college were sent to court to observe the functioning of the court under the guidance of teachers.

Students were given opportunity to visit the chambers of various advocates to sharpen their professional skills.

The teachers of the college are using various methods like, case law methods, discussion, case comments, seminar etc. in order to enhance the involvement of students in academic activities.

In the examination system new grading system is adopted for Environmental Studies paper of the BSL-III year. This paper is now a compulsory subject in our college apart from the Environmental Law paper, which gives sufficient opportunity to the students for knowing the environment and the role of law in protecting the environment.

This year the college was able to generate Rs.449219/- through self-financing courses.

This year the college appointed a full time teacher for sports and physical education to train and encourage students in various sports activities and games.

Apart from this the college also appointed three part time teachers for teaching various subjects.

The ratio between the teaching and non-teaching staff in our college is at present 7:8

Library

The library transactions in our college are fully computerised. We have purchased books worth Rs.91000/- in the library apart other reading materials, such as reports and journals.

The college is subscribing reports like SCC, AIR, Mah. L J etc and journal like the Harvard Law Review, JILI, IBR, Lawyers Collective, Current Central Legislations, etc.

Almost all the enactments of the Parliament are available in college on digital as well as print format.

The College is also running reading room till 8pm with the help of a student who is appointed in earn and learn scheme.

Students Feedback

Random feed back is collected from the students about the teachers, courses, campus, etc and the suggestions and comments are discussed in periodic meeting and the Principal of the college gives necessary instruction to the teaching and non-teaching staff from time to time.

Administration

The Unit Cost of education in our college is Rs.2868/- Office automation is completed in our college and all the computers are interconnected. The non-teaching staffs in our college have been given computer training and some of them were able to pass the MS-CIT examination conducted by the Government of Maharashtra.

The Internet facility is provided to the students and teachers of our college on payment of a nominal fee.

Students Welfare

The students of our college are given various financial aids such as EBC Scholarship, Merit Scholarship, Merit cum means scholarship, Central Government Scholarship for SC, ST, etc.

Periodical medical check up of the students is done with the help of local doctors.

Sports and Culture

In sports a students from our college won 1st prize in judo. Two students from our college were selected to represent the Swami Ramanand Theerth Maratwada University, Nanded in Inter University Cricket Championship held in Tamil Nadu. In badminton the college team became the zonal runner up in Swami Ramanand Theerth Maratwada University.

The students who have shown excellence in sports were presented with tracksuits, etc as an incentive from the College.

The college Moot Court team won IInd Prize in State Level Moot Court Competition held at Nanded. The team was also able to perform well in the All India Moot Court Competition held at Cochin, Kerala.

Healthy Practices

The College imparts environmental awareness to the students by teaching them environmental studies and environmental law as part of the curriculum.

The LL.B Second year and BSL IVth year students of our college-visited village “Bori” to study the socio-legal problems of the village people through a socio- legal survey. BSL I and II year students conducted a survey on Reasons for increase in Criminality in Latur under the guidance of Mr. More R V, Lecturer in our College.

The students of the college arranged a Legal Literacy Programme to provide legal knowledge to the village people.

The college was also able to arrange Blood Donation Programmes, Personality Development Programmes, and General Knowledge tests to enhance the competitive skills of the students.

The students are also taught Alternate Dispute Resolution Methods such as mediation, negotiation, etc through simulation exercises.

It is also notable that many academics and jurists including Hon'ble Shri.Ambadas Joshi, Judge, High court of Judicature, Bombay (Nagpur Bench); Shri.V.R.Jadhav, Joint Charity Commissioner, Latur; Shri.Kale AS, Member Industrial Court, Latur and Vinod Padalkar, Judge in Industrial Court, Latur visited our college and guided the staff and students. Adv.Satish Talekar, Member, Bar Council of Maharashtra and Goa also visited the College and delivered lecture to the students.

It is also to be noted that Adv.Vikram Hipperkar, a Lecturer of our College has been appointed as the Member of State Legal Services Authority, Maharashtra State.

Future

The college is having a plan to include the computer training to all students of our college to make them cope up with the changing requirement of present day.
