

## **ANNUAL QUALITY ASSURANCE REPORT 2008-2009**

It was in the year 2004 March; the NAAC peer team visited our college and granted the C +grade to the college. The evaluation done by the Peer Committee and the suggestion made thereafter provided a new impetus to the development of our college.

As a measure of implementing the suggestions of the Peer Team and for enhancing the quality of the college, by the beginning of the Academic year 2004-2005, along with the various committees for the internal functioning of the college, a Quality Assurance Cell and an Internal Quality Assurance Committee were constituted.

Now these Committees formulate various programmes for the enhancement of quality of education in college, keeping in mind its objectives

## **Curricular Aspects**

The college bagged 08 out of 12 merrits declared by the University this year. Most of the teachers are paper setters and examiners in the University. Some of the teachers are nominated as members of Board of Studies and Board of Examiners. The University also nominated some of our teachers as subject experts in various selection committees. Two teachers passed M.Phil and one passed UGCNET.

Teachers from our college participated in the National Seminars and state level seminars organised in various part of the country. Apart from this, the college also appointed two full time teachers fifteen part time teachers for teaching various subjects.

The ratio between the teaching and non-teaching staff in our college is at present 27: 10

Unit tests were conducted regularly to test the knowledge of the students. Continuous Moot Courts are arranged to test and enhance the professional skills of the

students. The Final year LL.B. students of our college were sent to court to observe the functioning of the court under the guidance of teachers.

Students were given opportunity to visit the chambers of various advocates to sharpen their professional skills.

The teachers of the college are using various methods like, case law methods, discussion, case comments, seminar etc. in order to enhance the involvement of students in academic activities.

In the examination system new grading system is adopted for Environmental Studies. It is now a compulsory subject in our college apart from the Environmental Law paper, which gives sufficient opportunity to the students for knowing the environment and the role of law in protecting the environment.

This year the college was able to generate Rs.1545292/- through self-financing courses.

### **Sports and Games**

The college is having a full time teacher for Sports and Physical Education to train and encourage students in various sports activities and games. Students of our college stood 2<sup>nd</sup> in the university Badminton and Malkhamp

competitions. 05 students of our college represented the university in various competitions.

## **Library**

The library transactions in our college are fully computerised. We have purchased books worth Rs.95062/- in the library apart from other reading materials, such as reports and journals.

The college is subscribing reports like Supreme Court Cases, All India Reporter, Maharashtra Law Journal, etc and journal like the Harvard Law Review, Journal of Indian Law Institute, Indian Bar Review, Lawyers Collective, Current Central Legislations, etc.

Almost all the enactments of the Parliament are available in college on digital as well as in print format. This year the college purchased 293 books and 1 CD to enrich the library. The college has made arrangements to purchase more computers for the purpose of providing more computer facilities to the students with the help of the fund provided by the local MLC. The college is providing the book bank facility to the students belonging to scheduled Cast and

Scheduled Tribe students. The College is also running reading room till 8pm with the help of a student who is appointed in "Earn and Learn Scheme".

### **Students Feedback**

Random feed back is collected from the students about the teachers, courses, campus, etc and the suggestions and comments are discussed in periodic meeting and the Principal of the college gives necessary instruction to the teaching and non- teaching staff from time to time.

### **Administration**

The Unit Cost of education in our college is Rs.12643/-. Office automation is completed in our college and all the computers are interconnected. The non-teaching staffs in our college have been given computer training and some of them were able to pass the MS-CIT examination conducted by the Government of Maharashtra.

The Internet facility is provided to the students and teachers of our college free of cost.

### **Students Welfare**

The students of our college are given various financial aids such as EBC Scholarship, Merit Scholarship,

Merit cum Means Scholarship, Central Government Scholarship for SC, ST, students, Scholarship for the Children of Primary teachers ,etc.The college also provide free admission to needy and poor students without charging any fees. Uniform are also provided to the poor students by the college. Periodical medical check up of the students is done with the help of local doctors.

### **Culture**

The college Moot Court team participated in various state level and national level competitions and won prizes. The college also conduct various cultural activities and encourage students by giving prizes.

### **Healthy Practices**

The College imparts environmental awareness to the students by teaching them environmental studies and environmental law as part of the curriculum. The students were taken to the near by sugar factory to see the measures taken by them to reduce pollution and to attend a public hearing.

The LL.B Second year and BSL IV th year students of our college-visited village "ramwadi" to study the socio-legal problems of the village people through a socio- legal survey.

The students of the college arranged a Legal Literacy Programme to provide legal knowledge to the village people.

The college was also able to arrange Blood Donation Programmes, Personality Development Programmes, and General Knowledge tests to enhance the competitive skills of the students.

The students are also taught Alternate Dispute Resolution Methods such as mediation, negotiation, etc through simulation exercises.

A career guidance programme on opportunities was also arranged by the college. Trees were planted in college as part of celebrating world Environment Day.

The students from our college visited the prison on a programme arranged by the Session Court, Latur to help the prisoners to draft application ,etc
