HISTORY

Dayanand Education Society :

The establishment of Dayanand Education Society, Latur, in May 1961 was a landmark in the annals of the history of education in the backward Marathwada Region of Maharashtra, which heralded a new era in the field of professional higher education which was rather an unfulfilled dream due to distant proximity and economic constraints. The founding fathers of the Society like Late Manikraoji Sonavane, Late Raja Narayanlalji Lahoti, Late Chandrashekherji Bajpai, Late Madanlalji Biyani, Shri. Shantibhai Shah, Late Nathmalji Innani, Late Ranaba Mandade, Late Ramgopalji Rathi, Late Tamanappa Utage, Late Keshavraoji Sonavane, Late Muralidharji Innani, Late Adv. Ramkishan Malu with the noble vision of disseminating knowledge to grass root levels, established a College for Arts, Commerce and Science, the foundation stone of which was laid by the auspicious hands of the then Governor of Maharashtra, His Excellency Shri. Shriprakash. The incessant struggle and unceasing efforts of the philanthropic founders of the Society with the motto from the sacred text of Rig-Veda 'Let noble thoughts come to us from all the directions of the Universe' resulted in developing the humble pioneering College of Arts, Commerce and Science into the standards of a blooming mini University with six independent Colleges in a sprawling campus of 22.5 acres of land in the heart of the city of Latur

Dayanand College of Law :

Dayanand College of Law took its humble birth in the precious hands of Dayanand Education Society in 1971, imparting professional and legal education to the young and aspiring youth of this region to pursue their career as independent professionals. The College was initially affiliated to Marathwada University, Aurangabad and later on in 1995 the College secured its permanent affiliation to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded. DEGREE PROGRAMMES OFFERED

A Centralized process which is based on a Common Entrance Test (CET) is conducted for admission to Three and Five Year Law Degree courses at Government-run, aided and unaided Law Colleges in Maharashtra, from the Academic year 2016-2017

1. LL.B. (Three Years Course) :

Eligibility For Admission: Graduation in any discipline with 45% or more marks from a recognised University.

Duration: Duration of this course is three years

2. B.A. LL.B. (Five Years Integrated Course) :

Eligibility For Admission: 10+2 pass with 45% or more marks from any recognised Board, this course is offered. It is an integrated course in which the candidate gets two Degrees.i) After successful completion of fifth year, B.A. LL.B. Degree.

Duration: Duration of this course is five years

3. LL.M. (Two Years Course): In Criminal Law and Business Law

Eligibility For Admission:

LL.B. Degree with minimum 50% or more marks from a recognised University

Duration: Duration of this course is two years.

4. Ph.D. in Law:

Eligibility For Admission : LL.M. with minimum 55% marks and a pass through the PET conducted by S.R.T.M.U. Nanded.

Duration : Duration of this course is three years. to Seven Years

5. Certificate Course in Human Rights Education:

Eligibility For Admission: 10+2 pass through standard examination conducted by the Board or any other examination equivalent to it

Duration : Duration of this course is six months.

6. P.G D.L.P.S.S. (P.G Diploma in Legal Process and Soft Skills):

Eligibility For Admission: Any Graduate from recognised University with minimum 40% marks

Duration : Duration of this course is one year.

7. P.G D.T.L. (P.G Diploma in taxation Law) One Year Course:

Eligibility For Admission: Any Graduate from a Any Graduate from a recognised University with minimum 45% marks

Duration: Duration of this course is one year.

8. P.G Diploma in Alternative Dispute Resolution.

Eligibility For Admission: Any Graduate from a recognised University with minimum 45% marks

Duration: Duration of this course is one year.

9. P.G Diploma in Intellectual Property Rights.

Eligibility For Admission: Any Graduate from a recognised University with minimum 45% marks

Duration: Duration of this course is one year.

DEPARTMENT -

Moot Court: The Moot Court Club is established with a vision to help the students to develop practical skills and self-confidence. It provides the research experience of collecting the relevant information on the specific issues involved in the cases and also to search for relevant citations. The Club also trains the students in the techniques of drafting the plaints, written statements and applications.

NSS: The NSS unit has been started for utilizing the student services for betterment of people in slums and adopted villages. The extension services to the society is the third dimension of Higher Education in addition to Teaching and Research. It provides information regarding counselling and support services on the campus, and promotes awareness about sexual harassment through educational initiatives that encourages and fosters a respectful and safe campus environment.

Women's Studies Centre : The social status of women is still shrouded by a variety of institutional complexes, inter personal relations and myths. To enable them stand in the great task of National development and to make them know about their role and status in today's social, economic, educational, legal, cultural and political spheres, this centre is constituted. It is intending to promote and strengthen women's studies through teaching, research, dissemination of knowledge and field action. The Centre has accepted the social responsibility to spread the feminist perspective, develop and empower the women.

Human Rights Education Centre : The national policy on education has laid considerable emphasis on value education by highlighting the need to make education of social and moral values. Human Rights Education is acquiring greater importance in the changing national and global scenario in the wake of globalisation which has thrown many new challenges in all areas of our national life. In order to institutionalise a rule of law and to build a human, participatory and democratic society the college has established a Human Rights Education Centre.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) : To provide quality legal Education, the IQAC is constituted which ensures continuous review and upgrading of teaching, library and office services and infrastructural facilities. The IQAC provides annual blue print designing curricular



and co-curricular activities to be conducted throughout the academic year and also monitors various programmes for the enrichment of staff teaching competency and students performance. IQAC also reviews all the activities of the Institution in the end of the year and prepares plans for the following academic year.

Alumni Association : Dayanand College of Law has formed an alumni association on its First meeting held on 6th Nov.2011. The vibrant alumni association of our college is a great asset to our institution. It is formed to promote and foster interaction between the alumni and its Alma mater.

Research Centre : The Dayanand College of Law, Latur has been recognised as a research centre in law faculty by Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University Nanded in 2010-34 2011. The Research Committee monitors and addresses the issues related to research.

The Institution provides adequate infrastructure and other facilities for the smooth progress of research schemes and projects. The Research centre is equipped with sufficient number of computers with free internet connectivity.

Cultural Department : The cultural Department of the College works with objective of developing the academic and cultural talents of the students, improving their capabilities to work as a team and raising their level of self confidence in interacting with the world. Its purpose is to develop the dynamic personality of the students. The cultural department provides numerous opportunities for students to enrich their cultural interests. The department encourages the students to take part in a wide variety of cultural competitions such as singing, dancing, debates, elocution, mehendi, rangoli etc. at college, university, state and national levels.

THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS

The Department of Physical Education Strives to promote the spirit of certain qualities like sportsmanship, team spirit, patience, co-operation and those other qualities of character and citizenship. The college is making use of the play ground in front of it for the sports activities. At present, the college is having facilities for Cricket, Volley ball and like games apart from the indoor games like Chess, Table Tennis, etc. It is notable that during the past few years many of the students of this college were selected to represent Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded in various events of games and sports and other extracurricular activities.

HOSTEL FACILITY

For Non local students the Institution provides hostel accommodation for boys and girls separately within the campus with all facilities including recreational, gymnasium, computer with internet, medical, library, entertainment etc. The Hostel has been tirelessly striving to encourage the students to pursue their aspirations by providing them all possible means. It provides disciplined and caring atmosphere.

CANTEEN FACILITIES

There are three canteens located within the campus: One at the main entrance and rest of the two are attached to boys and girls hostel separately. Food quality is maintained and subsidized.

DISCIPLINE

The college insists on a very high standard of discipline among the students in tune with the status and reputation of the college. The Disciplinary Committee under the Chairmanship of the Principal is the final authority in this regard. The Committee issues time to time norms and standards for students behaviour and code of conduct. Violation of these norms by the students is duly punished. The punishment includes fine, ban on issuing the library books, even cancellation of admission in the light of the severity of the case. Smoking, drinking alcoholic beverages, being inebriated in campus, dealings or consuming prohibited drugs, chewing pan or tobacco, immoral conduct and any behaviour disturbing the discipline of the college is severely punished. Damage to the property of the college is also severely dealt with and cost of repair and fine will be recovered from the students concerned or if concerned are not traceable Common Fine will be imposed. Thus, the college expects the students to take care of the property of the college as their own goods.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE STUDENTS

By exercising the power delegated by Hon 'ble Vice-Chancellor under **Maharashtra Universities Act, 2016**, the Principal of Dayanand College of Law, have made the following rules of discipline for the students.

1. Every student of the college has to attend at least 75% of the classes. Those who fail to secure minimum attendance of 75% will not be allowed to appear for University Examinations.
(Note: Attendance will be counted only if they are attending all the periods in a day.)
2. Attendance in practical classes will be compulsory. Otherwise they will not be allowed to appear for Practical Examinations.



3. Attendance in Unit Tests and Pre-Semester Examination will be compulsory.
4. Every student is supposed to keep their Identity Card and use Digital Identity Card in the premises of the college and produce it as and when required by the Principal, lecturers or any employee of the college or sister institutions.
5. **Students of BA. LL.B. Ist and IInd should attend the college in prescribed Uniform or else they shall not be allowed to attend the classes.**
6. Every student has to observe discipline in Class and College Premises, Library, Hostel, etc. in consonance with the best tradition of the college
7. Every student is expected to observe silence in class. They are strictly prohibited to loiter or wander about in college premises or any where during the period of class.
8. **Late comers will not be allowed to attend the classes.**
9. **Students are hereby instructed to switch off their Mobile Phones whenever they are entering in the college campus, otherwise punishment (including fine) will be imposed**
10. Students are not expected to do anything which disturbs the regular functions of the college.
11. Fine will be imposed on any student who damages college common property. If the wrongdoer is not traceable, **Common Fine** will be imposed.
12. Students are prohibited from doing any acts (Such as, late arrival, leaving the class before the bell without permission, chit-chatting, etc.) which disturb the classes individually or commonly.
13. Smoking, chewing-tobacco, consumption of intoxicating liquors, narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances or any prohibited substances in the college premises are strictly prohibited.
14. The students are expected to take utmost care of the library books, Fine will be imposed if the books are lost, students have to pay 1.5 (One and half time) of the existing price (Market Value) of the books as penalty.
15. Every student has to return the Library Books and Journals within time limit specified. Failure to return the Books and Journals in time will invite fine or any other appropriate punishment.
16. Every student has to return all the Library Books and Journals to the Library before the commencement of the University Examinations or at the time of obtaining "No Dues Certificate" from the Office.
17. Every student has to follow rules and regulations of the Library Advisory Committee from time to time or else severe punishment will be imposed.
18. Every student has to follow the instructions given by the concerned teachers during Youth Festival, Debate Competitions, Moot - Court Competitions, etc.
19. Every student should follow the instructions given by the Director of Physical Education and Sports during sports activities on the ground or during the play and in college premises.
20. Students should use the parking space provided for parking their vehicles, otherwise punishment (including fine) will be imposed.
21. As far as possible all decisions regarding Inauguration of the Students Council, will be taken by the Students Council even then decisions taken by the Professor-In-Charge and the Principal will be final and binding on all.
22. The students are expected to attend only those Class or Division to which he/she is admitted, otherwise fine will be imposed.
23. The students are not expected to keep any dangerous or harmful weapons or material, etc. with them.
24. Students have to collect their Hall Tickets for the University Examinations on the date specified by the college otherwise fine will be imposed.
25. Student has to obtain '**No Dues Certificate**' at the time of issuing Hall Tickets.
26. It is the responsibility of every candidate to submit proper documents. Any attempt to submit documents which are not genuine, will lead to cancellation of admission of the candidate, forfeiture of fees, deposits and expulsion of the candidate from the college by the Principal or by his authorised official. The name of such candidate/ students shall be deleted from the Merit List.
27. All the students are expected to follow the rules and regulations laid down by the **Disciplinary Committee or the Principal** from time to time in addition to the above mentioned rules and regulations
28. The students are expected to follow the above rules and regulations strictly else severe action (including fine) will be taken against those who violate the above rules.
29. **Violation of the discipline of the college or irregularity in the college or any above mentioned rule / rules of discipline for the students will be severely treated and their admission will be cancelled.**

ANTI-RAGGING REGULATION

Ragging is legally banned. It is a punishable offence. In view of the increasing number of events of ragging, the University Grants Commission has passed the "UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009. Ragging is any conduct by "any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or including in rowdy or in disciplined activities by any student which causes or is



likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in any ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing of power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student."

The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments namely,

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
2. Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
3. Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
4. Withholding results.
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel,
7. Cancellation of admission
8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters,
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment. The students are advised to consult the Anti-Ragging Committee in case of emergency.

RULES OF ADMISSION :

A Centralized process based on a Common Entrance Test (CET) conducted for admission to Three and Five Year Law Degree courses at Government-run, aided and unaided Law Colleges in Maharashtra, from the Academic year 2016-2017

1. **Admission to the Five Year Law Course** : - The Primary requisition for admission in the Five year Law Course will be the CET Score. The Candidate must have passed the HSC(10+2) examination conducted by the Board or any other examination with minimum 45% marks or any other examination equivalent to it, with the minimum prescribed marks is eligible for admission to the first year of the Pre Law Course. The Minimum percentage, which a student from the Reserved Category requires, to be eligible for admission is 40%.
2. **Admission to the Three Year Law Course** : - The Primary requisition for admission in the Three year Law Course will be the CET Score. A candidate passing the Bachelor's Degree Examination (10+2+3 Pattern) of the S.R.T.M.University, Nanded, in any faculty with minimum 45% marks or a corresponding Degree Examination of any other University recognised on equivalent thereto by the S.R.T.M.University, Nanded with the minimum prescribed marks is eligible for admission to the First year LL.B. The minimum percentage for reserved category requires, to be eligible for admission is 40%.



3. Students seeking admission to LL.M. should have secured minimum of 50% marks (in case of S.C. or S.T. Students 45%) in LL.B. Examination recognised by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.
 4. Students seeking admission to Ph.D. (Three Years Course) should have secured minimum 55% (in case of S.C. or S.T. students 50%) in Law Degree Examination from a recognised university.
 5. Students seeking admission to Certificate Course in Human Rights Education (6th month course) should have pass through 10+2 standard examination conducted by the Board or any other examination equivalent to it.
 6. Students seeking admission to P.G Diploma in Legal Process and Soft Skills (one year course) should have secured minimum 40% marks any graduate from a recognised University.
 7. Students seeking admission to P.G. Diploma in Taxation Law (One Year Course) should have secured minimum 45 % marks (in case of S.C. or S.T. Students 40%) in any Degree Examination recognised by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.
 8. All the admission procedures are as per the rules framed by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded, Govt. of Maharashtra, U.G.C. and Bar Council of India from time to time.
 9. Admission of the student to B.A. LL.B. Ist Year and LL.B. Ist Year are provisional; subject to the approval from Admission Regulating Authority of Govt. of Maharashtra and Eligibility sanctioned by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.
 10. The candidate seeking admission should produce the Originals of the following documents along with the application form.
 - a. Mark List of the qualifying examination.
 - b. Transfer Certificate.
 - c. Migration Certificate (If necessary).
 - d. Caste Certificate (If necessary).
 - e. Eligibility Certificate.
 - f. Income Certificate (As per Govt. Norms)
 - g. Two copies of E.B.C. application (If necessary.)
 - h. Certificate showing number of children in the family.
 - i. Blood Group Certificate.
 - j. Three passport size colour photographs.
 - k. Department NOC for Govt. or Non-Govt. Employees
 11. The admission for the Five Years Course and Three Years Course will be Admission Govt. of Maharashtra purely based on the merit as per the rules of admission given by Regulating Authority of Govt. of Maharashtra
 12. Admission will be closed once the sanctioned number of the students in the class are admitted or on expiry of the date fixed by the Admission Regulating Authority Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.
 13. Students have to pay all the necessary fee as per tariff at the time of admission, fixed by Fees Regulating Authority & Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded from time to time.
 14. If any student applies to cancel his / her admission, he / she has to pay the fees as per the noms of A.R.A. Registration fee once paid will not be refunded at any circumstances.
 15. The reservation policy for the admission will be Followed as per the

EVALUATION

The students of the college will be evaluated through Unit Tests, Seminars and general performance. The attendance in these examinations shall be compulsory. Those who fails to attend these examinations; fine will be imposed and even they will not be allowed to appear for the University Examination.



Semester Examination will normally be conducted in November/December and April/May every year subject to the time table scheduled by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.

The students who have secured an aggregate of 40% of the total marks in each paper will be declared passed in B.A.LL.B. First year and B.A.LL.B. Second year examinations. The Examination consist of theory paper for 50 marks which will be conducted by the university and Internal assessment for 25 marks i.e. CBCS Pattern.

Those students who secure not less than 40% marks in each paper will be declared passed in LL.B-I, II, III & B.A.,LL.B. III, IV, V Examinations. Those students who have secured 40% or more in 75% of the total subjects will be placed in A.T.K.T. for B.A.LL.B. -I to B.A.LL.B.-IV and LL.B-I to LL.B-II

The Examination for papers LL.B-I to L.L.B.III & B.A. L.L.B-III to B.S.L-V of theory paper for 75 marks which will be conducted by the University and assessment for 25 marks i.e. C.B.C.S. pattern.

The clinical Paper of Moot-Court and internship :

The clinical Paper of Moot-Court and internship shall be spread over in all semesters (Six Semesters). The Scheme of completion of said paper will be as follows.

1. Each student shall have to complete the 12-week internship during the course.
2. Each Semester the internship shall be for a period of two week.
3. Students shall submit their report of internship to the college in every semester. If report is not submitted, the progress of such students will not be considered.
4. The four clinical papers (practical papers) will be evaluated internally along with the subject expert of the S.R.T.M.U. Nanded.

The Scheme of the LL.B (Three Years)

There shall be 75 : 25 pattern in the theory papers including compulsory and optional papers. The scheme for 75 : 25 pattern will be as follows-

1. Theory paper will carry 75 marks for external examination and 25 marks will be for internal Evaluation. In external examinations the question paper will carry 08 (Eight) questions, out of which the students shall answer 05 (Five)
2. The scheme of Internal Evaluation shall be as follows.
 - a. There shall be two monthly tests assignments, each carries 7.5 marks totalling to 15 marks.
 - b. 10 Marks will be for regularity, active participation, for general performance and good behaviour in class room.

Individual head of passing :

The students shall obtain 40% of the total marks in external and internal separately for passing the examination (Individual head of passing)

The Scheme of the Pre-Law (Five Years)

In external examination question paper will carry 08 questions of 10 marks each.

The students will have to answer 05 Questions.

In Internal examination there will be 15 Marks for two monthly test and 10 Marks for general performance i.e. regularity, active participation, and good behaviour in class room.

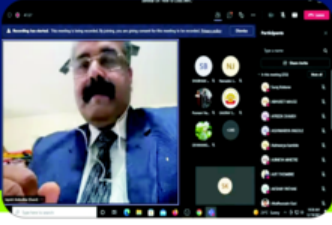
