The Harshad Mehta scam of 1992 was a major financial scandal in India where Mr. Mehta, a stockbroker, manipulated the banking system to inflate stock prices. He used fake Bank Receipts (BRs) to borrow large sums from banks and invested this money in shares, causing their prices to skyrocket. The scam led to an unsustainable stock market boom, which crashed once the manipulation was exposed. Investigative journalist Sucheta Dalal uncovered the scam, which resulted in widespread financial damage and bank losses. The case lead to banking and stock market reforms in India including stronger regulations from SEBI. Harshad Mehta was arrested but be died in 2001 while still facing several charges. The scam left a lasting impact on India's financial system, highlighting the need for better regulation and transparency.
