- K.M. Nanavati was an Indian Naval officer who moved to Bombay with his wife Sylvia and their children. During his absence, Sylvia developed an illicit relationship with Prem Ahuja. Upon returning home, Nanavati confronted

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Sylvia, who confessed to the affair, leading him to retrieve a loaded revolver from his ship. He first went to Ahuja's office but found him absent, so he drove to Ahuja's residence and shot him dead.

Nanavati was charged under section 302 and 304 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). He was tried by a sessions judge with a special jury, which returned a verdict of "not guilty" by 8 to 1. Dissatisfied with this verdict, the sessions judge referred the case to the Bombay High Court. The High Court concluded that Nanavati was guilty of murder under section 302 of the IPC and sentenced him to rigorous imprisonment for life.

The High Court's ruling highlighted misdirections in the Jury's charge, and both judge agreed that the evidence was sufficient to support a conviction for murder rather than a lesser charge.
