In 1954, they got their victim heavily drunk and struck him on the head with the intent to kill him. Believing they had succeeded, they threw his unconscious body over a cliff. However, the victim survived the fall but later died from exposure to the elements. The legal principle of mens rea (guilty mind) and actus reus (guilty deed) must occur simultaneously to constitute murder. The gang claimed that the two elements were not present at the same time because they intended to kill him in the hut but caused his death later. Ultimately, the court ruled that their actions were part of the same continuous act, finding them guilty of murder.
