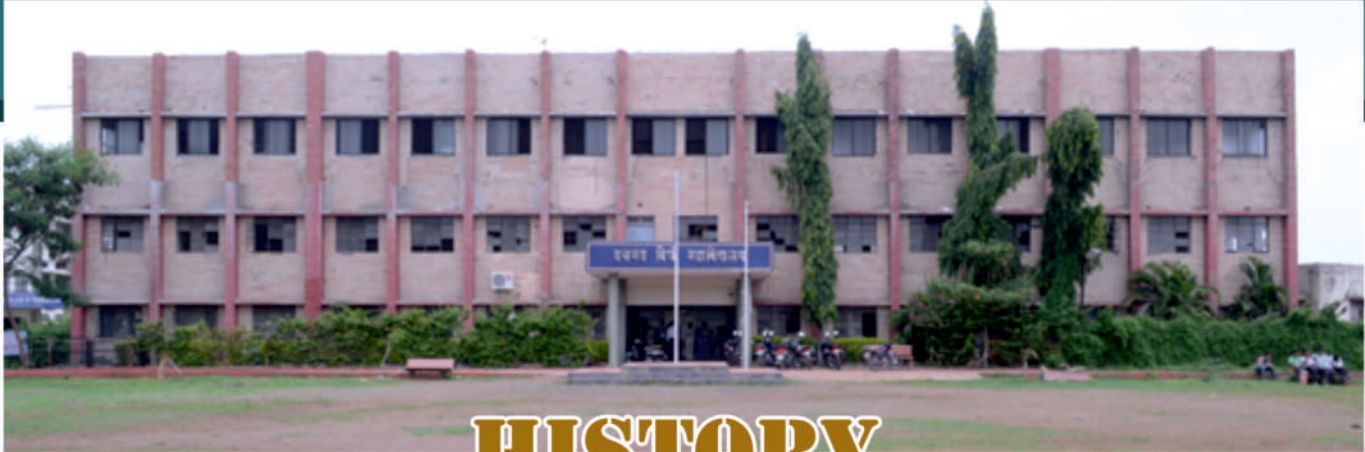

HISTORY

Dayanand Education Society :

The establishment of Dayanand Education Society, Latur, in May 1961 was a landmark in the annals of the history of education in the backward Marathwada Region of Maharashtra, which heralded a new era in the field of professional higher education which was rather an unfulfilled dream due to distant proximity and economic constraints. The founding fathers of the Society like Late Manikraoji Sonavane, Late Raja Narayanlalji Lahoti, Late Chandrashekherji Bajpai, Late Madanlalji Biyani, Shri. Shantibhai Shah, Late Nathmalji Innani, Late Ranaba Mandade, Late Ramgopalji Rathi, Late Tamanappa Utage, Late Keshavraoji Sonavane, Late Muralidharji Innani, Late Adv. Ramkishan Malu with the noble vision of disseminating knowledge to grass root levels, established a College for Arts, Commerce and Science, the foundation stone of which was laid by the auspicious hands of the then Governor of Maharashtra, His Excellency Shri. Shriprakash. The incessant struggle and unceasing efforts of the philanthropic founders of the Society with the motto from the sacred text of Rig-Veda 'Let noble thoughts come to us from all the directions of the Universe' resulted in developing the humble pioneering College of Arts, Commerce and Science into the standards of a blooming mini University with six independent Colleges in a sprawling campus of 22.5 acres of land in the heart of the city of Latur

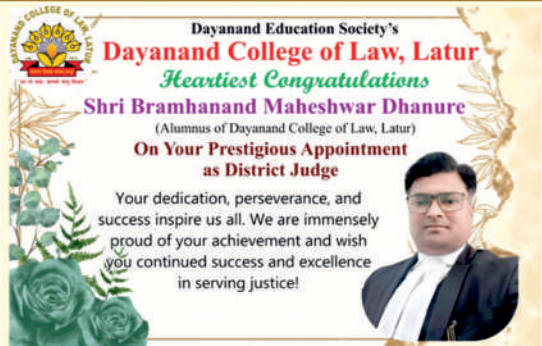

A Centralized process which is based on a Common Entrance Test (CET) is conducted for admission to Three and Five Year Law Degree courses at Government-run, aided and unaided Law Colleges in Maharashtra, from the Academic year 2016-2017

1. LL.B. (Three Years Course) :

Eligibility For Admission: Graduation in any discipline with 45% or more marks from a recognised University.

Duration: Duration of this course is three years

2. B.A. LL.B. (Five Years Integrated Course) :

Eligibility For Admission: 10+2 pass with 45% or more marks from any recognised Board, this course is offered. It is an integrated course in which the candidate gets two Degrees.i) After successful completion of fifth year, B.A. LL.B. Degree.

Duration: Duration of this course is five years

3. LL.M. (Two Years Course): In Criminal Law and Business Law

Eligibility For Admission:

LL.B. Degree with minimum 50% or more marks from a recognised University

Duration : Duration of this course is two years.

4. Ph.D. in Law:

Eligibility For Admission : LL.M. with minimum 55% marks and a pass through the PET conducted by S.R.T.M.U. Nanded.

Duration : Duration of this course is three years. to Seven Years

5. Certificate Course in Human Rights Education:

Eligibility For Admission: 10+2 pass through standard examination conducted by the Board or any other examination equivalent to it

Duration : Duration of this course is six months.

6. P.G.D.T.L. (P.G Diploma in taxation Law) One Year Course:

Eligibility For Admission: Any Graduate from a Any Graduate from a recognised University with minimum 45% marks

Duration: Duration of this course is one year.

7. P.G Diploma in Alternative Dispute Resolution.

RULES OF ADMISSION

A Centralized process based on a Common Entrance Test (CET) conducted for admission to Three and Five Year Law Degree courses at Government-run, aided and unaided Law Colleges in Maharashtra, from the Academic year 2016-2017

1. **Admission to the Five Year Law Course :** - The Primary requisition for admission in the Five year Law Course will be the CET Score. The Candidate must have passed the HSC(10+2) examination conducted by the Board or any other examination with minimum 45% marks or any other examination equivalent to it, with the minimum prescribed marks is eligible for admission to the first year of the Pre Law Course. The Minimum percentage, which a student from the Reserved Category requires, to be eligible for admission is 40%.
2. **Admission to the Three Year Law Course :** - The Primary requisition for admission in the Three year Law Course will be the CET Score. A candidate passing the Bachelor's Degree Examination (10+2+3 Pattern) of the S.R.T.M. University, Nanded, in any faculty with minimum 45% marks or a corresponding Degree Examination of any other University recognised on equivalent thereto by the S.R.T.M. University, Nanded with the minimum prescribed marks is eligible for admission to the First year LL.B. The minimum percentage for reserved category requires, to be eligible for admission is 40%.
3. **Admission to the LL.M. :**
Students seeking admission to LL.M. should have secured minimum of 50% marks (in case of S.C. or S.T. Students 45%) in LL.B. Examination recognised by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.
4. **Admission to the Ph.D. :**
Students seeking admission to Ph.D. (Three Years Course) should have secured minimum 55% (in case of S.C. or S.T. students 50%) in Law Degree Examination from a recognised university.
5. **Admission to the Certificate Course in Human Rights Education :**
Students seeking admission to Certificate Course in Human Rights Education (6th month course) should have pass through 10+2 standard examination conducted by the Board or any other examination equivalent to it.
6. **Admission to the P.G. Diploma in Legal Process and Soft Skills :**
Students seeking admission to P.G. Diploma in Legal Process and Soft Skills (one year course) should have secured minimum 40% marks any graduate from a recognised University.
7. **Admission to the P.G. Diploma in Taxation Law :**
Students seeking admission to P.G. Diploma in Taxation Law (One Year Course) should have secured minimum 45 % marks (in case of S.C. or S.T. Students 40%) in any Degree Examination recognised by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.
8. All the admission procedures are as per the rules framed by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded, Govt. of Maharashtra, U.G.C. and Bar Council of India from time to time.
9. Admission of the student to B.A. LL.B. Ist Year and LL.B. Ist Year are provisional; subject to the approval from Admission Regulating Authority of Govt. of Maharashtra and Eligibility sanctioned by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.

11. The admission for the Five Years Course and Three Years Course will be Admission Govt. of Maharashtra purely based on the merit as per the rules of admission given by Regulating Authority of Govt. of Maharashtra
12. Admission will be closed once the sanctioned number of the students in the class are admitted or on expiry of the date fixed by the Admission Regulating Authority Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.
13. Students have to pay all the necessary fee as per tariff at the time of admission, fixed by Fees Regulating Authority & Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded from time to time.

EVALUATION

The students of the college will be evaluated through Unit Tests, Seminars and general performance. The attendance in these examinations shall be compulsory. Those who fail to attend these examinations; fine will be imposed and even they will not be allowed to appear for the University Examination.

Semester Examination will normally be conducted in November/December and April/May every year subject to the time table scheduled by the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.

The students who have secured an aggregate of 40% of the total marks in each paper will be declared passed in B.A.LL.B. First year and B.A.LL.B. Second year examinations. The Examination consist of theory paper for 50 marks which will be conducted by the university and Internal assessment for 25 marks i.e. CBCS Pattern.

Those students who secure not less than 40% marks in each paper will be declared passed in LL.B-I, II, III & B.A.,LL.B. III, IV, V Examinations. Those students who have secured 40% or more in 75% of the total subjects will be placed in A.T.K.T. for B.A.LL.B. -I to B.A.LL.B.-IV and LL.B-I to LL.B-II

The Examination for papers LL.B-I to L.L.B.III & B.A. L.L.B-III to B.S.L-V of theory paper for 75 marks which will be conducted by the University and assessment for 25 marks i.e. C.B.C.S. pattern.

The clinical Paper of Moot-Court and internship :

The clinical Paper of Moot-Court and internship shall be spread over in all semesters (Six Semesters). The Scheme of completion of said paper will be as follows.

1. Each student shall have to complete the 12-week internship during the course.
2. Each Semester the internship shall be for a period of two week.
3. Students shall submit their report of internship to the college in every semester. If report is not submitted, the progress of such students will not be considered.
4. The four clinical papers (practical papers) will be evaluated internally along with the subject expert of the S.R.T.M.U. Nanded.

Examination Rules for Theory and Internal Evaluation

- * Assessment Shall consist of continuous assessment (CA) and end of semester examination (ESE)
- * Weightage : 75% for ESE and 25% for CA
- * The CA towards 25 marks will be a continuous activity and at least two written tests must be conducted for a full paper of 4 credits.
 - Open book test / Assignments / Projects, may be conducted (not more than two for each paper) for 15 Marks.
 - General performance is of 10 marks for completing the course teacher is required to take Seminar Presentation, Court Visit, visit to Government Officer, field visit at rural areas, Group Discussions and Lok Adalat visit, forensic lab visit, Jail Visit etc. whichever is relevant.
- Note - the teacher should select a variety of mechanism for evaluation of this part such as
 - Active participation in class
 - Assignment
 - Extension Work etc.
- * ESE for the remaining 75% marks will be conducted by the University
- * A student has to obtain 40% marks in the combined examination of CA and ESE with a minimum passing of 40% in both these separately.

- * To pass the degree program, a student will have to obtain a minimum aggregate of 40% marks (E and above in grade scale) in each course.
- * If a student misses an internal assessment examination he/she will have a second chance with endorsement of the Principal in consultation with the concerned teacher, such a second chance shall not be the right of the student.
- * A student cannot register for the 3rd and 5th semester if he / she fails to complete 75% of the total credits expected to be ordinary completed up to 2nd and 4th semester respectively.
- * While marks will be given for all examinations they will be converted into graders. The semester and grade sheets will have only grades and final grade sheets and transcripts shall have grade points average and total percentage of marks (up to decimal points). The final grade sheet will also indicate the college/ Centre to which the candidate belongs.

- 5. Remote access to e-resources
- 6. Websites of INFLIBNET- N - LIST Supreme Court of India, Indian Law Institute, Bar Council of India, Bombay High court, Directory of open access Journals, be press, SSRN, BAIL II, ALII, ILII, Indian kanoon, etc to get access to more eresources.



• **Moot Court:** The Moot Court Club is established with a vision to help the students to develop practical skills and self-confidence. It provides the research experience of collecting the relevant information on the specific issues involved in the cases and also to search for relevant citations. The Club also trains the students in the techniques of drafting the plaints, written statements and applications.



• **NSS:** The NSS unit has been started for utilizing the student services for betterment of people in slums and adopted villages. The extension services to the society is the third dimension of Higher Education in addition to Teaching and Research. The College NSS Unit is trying to link Higher Education with the socio -economic conditions of the society and hence the activities are undertaken for the welfare of the weaker sections of the society. Many programmes have been planned and executed by the NSS Unit which could create a very positive impact on the society.



• **Legal Aid Clinic:** The College has a Legal Aid Clinic. It has set up collaboration with District Legal Services Authority, Latur. The aim and object of Legal Aid Clinic is to ensure that the opportunities for securing justice are not denied to- any person by reason of poverty, illiteracy, ignorance or inaccessibility. The object of the Legal Aid Clinic is to ensure equal justice and provide justice at door steps. This activity also enables the students to develop interactive and interviewing skills to fare well in their career as legal practitioners. The Clinic works on every second and fourth Saturday from 9.00am to 5.00pm.



• **Women's Grievance Cell :** The Institution has established Women's Grievance Cell with the objectives of redressing the grievances of the students and the staff of any sort related to women. It provides information regarding counselling and support services on the campus, and promotes awareness about sexual harassment through educational initiatives that encourages and fosters a respectful and safe campus environment.



• **Women's Studies Centre :** The social status of women is still shrouded by a variety of institutional complexes, inter personal relations and myths. To enable them stand in the great task of National development and to make them know about their role and status in today's social, economic, educational, legal, cultural and political spheres, this centre is constituted. It is intending to promote and strengthen women's studies through teaching, research, dissemination of knowledge and field action. The Centre has accepted the social responsibility to spread the feminist perspective, develop and empower the women.



● **Human Rights Education Centre :** The national policy on education has laid considerable emphasis on value education by highlighting the need to make education of social and moral values. Human Rights Education is acquiring greater importance in the changing national and global scenario in the wake of globalisation which has thrown many new challenges in all areas of our national life. In order to institutionalise a rule of law and to build a human, participatory and democratic society the college has established a Human Rights Education Centre.



● **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) :** To provide quality legal Education, the IQAC is constituted which ensures continuous review and upgrading of teaching , library and office services and infrastructural facilities. The IQAC provides annual blue print designing curricular and co-curricular activities to be conducted throughout the academic year and also monitors various programmes for the enrichment of staff teaching competency and students performance. IQAC also reviews all the activities of the Institution in the end of the year and prepares plans for the following academic year.



● **Alumni Association :** Dayanand College of Law has formed an alumni association on its First meeting held on 6th Nov.2011. The vibrant alumni association of our college is a great asset to our institution. It is formed to promote and foster interaction between the alumni and its Alma mater.



● **Research Centre :** The Dayanand College of Law, Latur has been recognised as a research centre in law faculty by Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University Nanded in 2010-34 2011. The Research Committee monitors and addresses the issues related to research.

The Institution provides adequate infrastructure and other facilities for the smooth progress of research schemes and projects. The Research centre is equipped with sufficient number of computers with free internet connectivity.



● **Career Guidance Cell :** The cell offers access to a wide range of resources, including career guides, job listings, internship opportunities, and information about further education and specialization programs. It keeps students updated on the latest developments in the legal industry and provides guidance on relevant skills and qualifications needed for different career paths.

The cell facilitates networking opportunities by organizing guest lectures, seminars, workshops, and networking events featuring legal professionals, alumni, and industry experts. These interactions enable students to build professional connections, seek mentorship, and gain valuable insights into the legal profession.

One of the primary functions of a career guidance cell is to assist students in securing internships and placement opportunities. It provides guidance on preparing resumes, writing cover letters, and preparing for interviews. It also liaises with law firms, corporate legal departments, government agencies, and NGOs to facilitate internships and placement drives.



● **Cultural Department :** The cultural Department of the College works with objective of developing the academic and cultural talents of the students, improving their capabilities to work as a team and raising their level of self confidence in interacting with the world. Its purpose is to develop the dynamic personality of the students. The cultural department provides numerous opportunities for students to enrich their cultural interests. The department encourages the students to take part in a wide variety of cultural competitions such as singing, dancing, debates, elocution, mehendi, rangoli etc. at college, university, state and national levels.



● **THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS**

The Department of Physical Education Strives to promote the spirit of certain qualities like sportsmanship, team spirit, patience, co-operation and those other qualities of character and citizenship. The college is making use of the play ground in front of it for the sports activities. At present, the college is having facilities for Cricket, Volley ball and like games apart from the indoor games like Chess, Table Tennis, etc. It is notable that during the past few years many of the students of this college were selected to represent Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded in various events of games and sports

and other extracurricular activities.



• **HOSTEL FACILITY**

For Non local students the Institution provides hostel accommodation for boys and girls separately within the campus with all facilities including recreational, gymnasium, computer with internet, medical, library, entertainment etc. The Hostel has been tirelessly striving to encourage the students to pursue their aspirations by providing them all possible means. It provides disciplined and caring atmosphere.

• **CANTEEN FACILITIES**

There are three canteens located within the campus: One at the main entrance and rest of the two are attached to boys and girls hostel separately. Food quality is maintained and subsidized.

• **DISCIPLINE**

The college insists on a very high standard of discipline among the students in tune with the status and reputation of the college. The Disciplinary Committee under the Chairmanship of the Principal is the final authority in this regard. The Committee issues time to time norms and standards for students behaviour and code of conduct. Violation of these norms by the students is duly punished. The punishment includes fine, ban on issuing the library books, even cancellation of admission in the light of the severity of the case. Smoking, drinking alcoholic beverages, being inebriated in campus, dealings or consuming prohibited drugs, chewing pan or tobacco, immoral conduct and any behaviour disturbing the discipline of the college is severely punished. Damage to the property of the college is also severely dealt with and cost of repair and fine will be recovered from the students concerned or if concerned are not traceable Common Fine will be imposed.



RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE STUDENTS

Thus, the college expects the students to take care of the property of the college as their own goods.

By exercising the power delegated by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor under the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016, the Principals of Dayanand College of Law have made the following rules of discipline for the students.

1. Every student of the college has to attend at least 75% of the classes. Those who fail to secure minimum attendance of 75% will not be allowed to appear for University Examinations. (Note: attendance will be counted only if they are attending all the periods in a day.)
2. Attendance in practical classes will be compulsory. otherwise they will not be allowed to appear for Practical Examinations.
3. Attendance in Unit Tests and Pre-Semester Examination will be compulsory.
4. Every student is supposed to keep their Identity Card and use Digital Identity Card in the premises of the college and produce it as and when required by the Principal, Lecturers or any employee of the college or sister institutions.
5. Students of BA, LL.B I and II should attend the college in prescribed uniform or else they shall not be allowed to attend the classes.
6. Every student has to observe discipline in Class and College Premises, Library, Hostel, etc, in consonance with the best tradition of the college.
7. Every student is expected to observe silence in class. They are strictly prohibited to loiter or wander about in college premises or any where during the period of class.
8. Late comers will not be allowed to attend the classes.
9. Students are hereby instructed to switch off their Mobile Phones whenever they are entering in the college campus, otherwise punishment (including fine) will be imposed.
10. Students are not expected to do anything which disturbs the regular functions of the college.
11. Fine will be imposed on any student who damages college common property. If the wrongdoer is not traceable, Common Fine will be imposed.
12. Students are prohibited from doing any acts (Such as, late arrival, leaving the class before the bell without permission, chit-chatting, etc.) which disturb the classes individually or commonly.
13. Smoking, chewing-tobacco, consumption of intoxicating liquors, narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances or any prohibited substances in the college premises are strictly prohibited
14. The students are expected to take at most care of the library books, Fine will be imposed if the books are lost, students have to pay 1½ (One and half time) of the existing price (Market Value) of the books as penalty.
15. Every student has to return the Library Books and Journals within time limit specified. Failure to return the Books and Journals in time will invite fine or any other appropriate punishment.
16. Every student has to return all the Library Books and Journals to the Library before the commencement of the University Examinations or at the time of obtaining "No Dues Certificate" from the Office.
17. Every student has to follow rules and regulations of the Library Advisory Committee from time to time or else severe punishment will be imposed.
18. Every student has to follow the instructions given by the concerned teachers during Youth Festival, Debate Competitions. Moot-Court Competitions, etc.
19. Every student should follow the instructions given by the Director of Physical Education and Sports during sports activities on the ground or during the play and in college premises.
20. Students should use the parking space provided for parking their vehicles, otherwise punishment (including fine) will be imposed.
21. As far as possible all decisions regarding Inauguration of the Students Council, will be taken by the Students Council, even then decisions taken by the Professor-In-Charge and the Principal will be final and binding on all.
22. The students are expected to attend only those Class or Division to which he / she is admitted, otherwise fine will be imposed.
23. The students are not expected to keep any dangerous or harmful weapons or material, etc. with them.
24. Students have to collect their Hall Tickets for the University Examinations on the date specified by the college otherwise fine will be imposed.
25. Student has to obtain 'No Dues Certificate' at the time of issuing Hall Tickets.
26. It is the responsibility of every candidate to submit proper documents. Any attempt to submit documents which are not genuine, will lead to cancellation of admission of the candidate, forfeiture of fees, deposits and expulsion of the candidate / student from the college by the Principal or by his authorized official. The name of such candidate / student/s shall be deleted from the Merit List.
27. As per the provisions of Maharashtra Act XXXIII known as Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act of 1999 students indulging in ragging can be punished under the Act resulting in suspension, expulsion from the college and imprisonment.
28. All the students are expected to follow the rules and regulations laid down by the Disciplinary Committee or the Principal from time to time in addition to the above mentioned rules and regulations.
29. The students are expected to follow the above rules and regulations strictly else severe action (including fine) will be taken against those who violate the above rules.
30. Violation of the discipline of the college or irregularity in the college or any above mentioned rule /rules of discipline for the students will be severely treated and their admission will be cancelled.

ANTI-RAGGING REGULATION



Ragging is legally banned. It is a punishable offence. In view of the increasing number of events of ragging, the University Grants Commission has passed the "UOC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009. Ragging is any conduct by "any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or including in rowdy or in disciplined activities by any student which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in any ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing of power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student."

The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by

the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments namely,

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
2. Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
3. Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
4. Withholding results.
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel,
7. Cancellation of admission
8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters,
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment. The students are advised to consult the Anti- Ragging Committee in case of emergency.

रॅगिंग करणे हा कायदानुसार गुन्हा आहे. रॅगिंगच्या वाढत्या घटनांमुळे विद्यापीठ अनदान आयोगाने २००९ मध्ये रॅगिंग करणाऱ्याला कठोर शिक्षेची तरतूद असलेला अधिनियम प्रसारित केला. रॅगिंगसंदर्भात या विद्यापीठात रॅगिंग प्रतिबंधक समिती स्थापन करण्यात आली असून या अधिनियमाची कठोर अंमलबजावणी विद्यापीठात केली जाणार आहे. रॅगिंग हा दुसऱ्या विद्यार्थ्याला शारीरिक किंवा मानसिक क्लेश होईल असे वर्तन करणाऱ्याचा एक घृणास्पद अवमानी व विकृत प्रकार आहे. रॅगिंगमुळे निष्ठाप विद्यार्थ्यांचे खच्चीकरण तर होतच, परंतु रॅगिंगमुळे प्रसंगी एखादा विद्यार्थी प्राणासही मुकू शकतो. रॅगिंगमध्ये खालील बाबींचा अंतर्भाव होतो.

नवप्रवेशित विद्यार्थ्याला बालेनू, लिहून, उद्धटपणे वागून त्याला / तिला मानसिक किंवा शारीरिक इजा पोहचविणे. इतरांची मानहानी करणारे व लज्जा उत्पन्न करणारे वर्तन करणे. नवप्रवेशित विद्यार्थ्यांवर वरिष्ठत्वाच्या नात्याने जोरजुलूम करणे, दहशत उत्पन्न करणे.

रॅगिंग करणाऱ्याला शिक्षा :

SUMMER CAMP 2025

Dayanand College of Law, Latur organized a comprehensive and practice-oriented Summer Camp on Trial Court Advocacy Skills from 5th to 20th May 2025. The camp featured daily expert lectures delivered by eminent judges, senior advocates, and legal officers, covering various procedural, substantive, and professional aspects of trial court practice. The Summer Camp was inaugurated with great enthusiasm in the presence of senior legal luminaries, members of the management of Dayanand Education Society, faculty, and students. The program's objectives were laid out, emphasizing skill development, practical courtroom exposure, and ethical grounding.

Hon'ble Ms. Aarti Shinde, Principal Magistrate, Juvenile Court Latur delivered the first insightful lecture on the procedural and substantive aspects of juvenile justice. She explained the constitution, jurisdiction, and functioning of the Juvenile Justice Board and Special Court. The distinction in approach for children in conflict with law and the sensitivity mandated under the JJ Act were effectively conveyed. The interactive session enriched students with practical insights into courtroom behaviour and documentation.

Hon'ble Shri R. Y. Shaikh, Retd. Principal District Judge, delivered expert lecture on "Navigating the Criminal Trial" which provided a step-by-step overview of criminal trial processes. Hon'ble Shri Sunil Desai, Senior Advocate discussed trial procedures under the Prevention of Corruption Act. Hon'ble Adv. Shri Ashishji Bajpai, Senior Advocate & CDC Member, emphasized mastering jurisdiction in civil matters and the development of advocacy skills. Hon'ble Adv. Shriram Deshpande, Senior Advocate explained the civil trial process in detail. Hon'ble Adv. Shri Vishal Dixit, Senior Advocate provided practical insights on discipline, office management, and relationships with clients, Bar, and Bench. Hon'ble Adv. P. T. Dhage, Senior Advocate covered jurisdiction and processes before Cooperative Courts and DRTs. Hon'ble Adv. Sanjayji Pande, Senior Advocate focused on effective methods for learning law. He encouraged disciplined reading of Bare Acts, legal reasoning, and courtroom etiquette. The session emphasized empathy, ethics, and moral responsibility in legal practice. Hon'ble PI Shri Sudhakar Ram Dede, MIDC Police Station, Latur provided a detailed account of police procedures from FIR to chargesheet. He discussed CrPC provisions, digital tools like eSakshya, and evidentiary practices. Hon'ble Adv. Shri Tanmay A. Bajpai guided students on the initial phase of legal practice. He advised on reading habits, research skills, client counselling, and preparedness for trials. The camp concluded with an impactful session by Hon'ble Adv. Deore Sir, an eminent legal figure. He spoke on grooming new advocates in civil and criminal litigation. Hon'ble Shri. Ajay Deore, Addl. SP. Latur delivered valedictory lecture commending the innovative vision of the college and lauding the camp's holistic focus on developing students' practical legal skills.

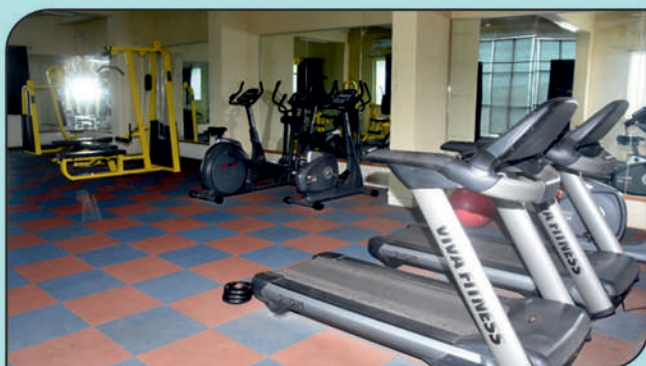
